## THE HOSTING PARTNER

The 4<sup>th</sup> transnational project meeting of the NEURO-GUIDE project was organized by the Czech Republic partner – **REINTEGRA**.

**REINTEGRA** is a not-for-profit organization, established in 1999 in Krnov, in the Czech Republic. It has become a regional market leader in all forms of reintegration into society and job market. The mission of the organization is to help disadvantaged persons, (such as minorities, migrants, disabled people, people with learning difficulties etc.) to find again employment and to join the civic and common life, as well as to integrate new teaching and learning methods for

## THE MEETING SCHEDULE

Since the partnership is now gradually entering the final stages of the project, the 4<sup>th</sup> project meeting focused on the final stages, deadlines and discussions to clarify all of the remaining project tasks, and to plan the upcoming dissemination, piloting and training activities.

The meeting started with introductions and greetings followed by a short review of the project – recent outputs, objectives, schedule and methodologies. Partners discussed among other things, the final version of IO1 – Online Escape Room Compendium of Resources, IO2 – In Service Training Programme and Handbook and IO3 – Online Learning Platform. Attention was paid to the piloting of the completed outputs in all the countries of the partnership.

Additionally, the consortium discussed the administration, technical and management issues of the project, and the meeting concluded with a clear division of tasks among partners and line of sight to the end of the main project activities in the coming months.



# LTTA SHORT-TERM JOINT STAFF TRAINING EVENT

From the 11<sup>th</sup> to the 13<sup>th</sup> of December 2019, 15 participants attended the LTTA-Short-Term Joint Staff Training Event, this 3 day – 20+ hour transnational training took place in Ireland.

The aim of this short training event was to develop new teaching resources and competencies to meet emerging market needs and address up-skilling needs of young people in the VET sector.

Participants developed practical skills for supporting marginalised young people including developing necessary pedagogic skills, creative and critical thinking skills, build the digital competence and entrepreneurial spirit.

Training was delivered through a series of practical workshops, where group discussion, practical assignments and role-play activities were delivered to ensure that each participant left the transnational training event with the confidence and experience they needed to support the delivery of the Online Escape Room Compendium of Resources (IO1), and the In-service Training Programme (IO2) to other VET professionals in their region as part of the cascading model of training.
